

Introduction

The Transport for Canberra youth consultation was held in conjunction with the broader Draft Planning Strategy consultation of which 250+ young people participated. The consultation was undertaken by ESDD's school liaison and education officer in consultation with the Transport for Canberra team.

The primary purpose for conducting the road shows was to collect data from young people who live, work, play or study in Canberra and who have an interest in its growth and development. Each young person was given a Transport for Canberra fact sheet and electronic links to the strategy itself prior to the 50 minute road show. After the road show presentations, young people were asked to openly discuss the Planning Strategy and key transport issues with the facilitator. They were then asked to complete a youth specific online survey. The survey results from the transport survey make up this report.

Facilitator's summary

Throughout the road show, there was general consensus that the public transport system in Canberra was valued and needed to be the centre piece for the further development of Canberra.

Much of the road show discussion and online feedback identified several observations about the current transport system that was also identified as potential barriers to its improvement. Comments were categorised in the following:

- reliability
- efficiency
- frequency
- cost effectiveness (as an alternative to cars).

The following report presents verbatim responses from the online Transport for Canberra plan.

Sample responses

'I would like to see it reach a level of efficiency where virtually no one would have their own private transport which would greatly benefit the environment and decrease congestion'.

'It will either go two ways one way, lots of people will start using it because there will be no choice or the other way, we will get so much more money that everyone will want a car no matter what'.

'I would like to see registration for bikes introduced. They use the roads and bike paths, governments make them for them so why don't they pay a small fee to register them. The money can then go to making even better roads for bike riders. People will pay if they see that they will get better paths'.

Young people's comments: 16-22yrs

- Light rail/underground subway or transport
- We need to be more efficient with our development of roads. Roadwork's around the gold creek area and in Belconnen are taking far too long, and have been going for years.
