

START OF WORKS – WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU



The ACT Government is building light rail to Woden. We are investing in our city's future by ensuring Canberra is a more connected, sustainable and vibrant city.

Light rail to Woden is Canberra's biggest ever infrastructure project. The construction of light rail to Woden is part of the ACT government's \$14 billion Infrastructure Plan that will support thousands of local jobs and our city's economic recovery.

The first stage of light rail to Woden is extending the light rail network by 1.7 kilometres from the city to Commonwealth Park and adding three new stops at Edinburgh Avenue, City South and Commonwealth Park.

To enable the future light rail construction, early works will be undertaken until mid-2022. While early works take place, the ACT Government is continuing to develop the light rail to Woden project design and prepare the project approval documentation.

What works are happening?

Early works involve translocating Golden Sun Moths, setting up construction site compounds and starting utility relocation work.

Construction site compounds will be established at the Corner of Marcus

Clarke and Gordon Street, and the southeast end of Constitution Avenue.

Site compounds will be used for site offices, storage, construction parking and utility installation during construction.

The establishment of site compounds will result in reduced public parking.

Golden Sun Moth translocation works have commenced with the translocation starting in July, you can learn more on our website.

When are the works happening?

Construction site compounds and utility relocation work will commence **early August 2021** and are expected to be ongoing until **early/mid-2022**.

Will there be night works?

Night works will occur for critical utility relocations and works. You will be notified in advance of night works via letterbox notifications and phone calls.

What you'll see

In the project area you can expect to start seeing:

- installation of site construction compounds
- installation of temporary fencing
- short delays and traffic changes on local roads
- changes to pathways and pedestrian routes
- increased vehicle and machinery movements onsite and on local roads
- increased noise and dust with utility works
- delivery of materials

Join our in-person and virtual community information sessions

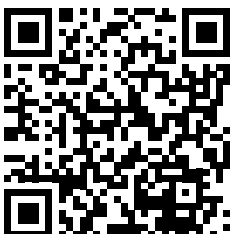
We want to hear from you about local priorities and concerns which will help inform the final design, reduce the impacts of construction where possible and maximise the local benefits of light rail.
